PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

HEARING OF THE PUBLIC

Jennie Hagerty

Jennie Hagerty, Fairview: Ms. Hagerty stated she was there on behalf of the Mercy Center and is their Executive Director. She acknowledged Mr. Winarski as their Council representative. She reminded the Council that she had been there previously and gave them detailed information on their programs and their amazing success rate. She stated that they service people from all zip codes of Erie County. She professed that ARPA dollars should be spent on these types of programs, helping the less fortunate and under privileged, and they should not be given to multi-million dollar entities.

This money could change lives. She stated they were not able to Zoom in during the pandemic, and were there 24/7 helping people while others were closed down during the pandemic.

Carl Anderson

Carl Anderson, Erie: Mr. Anderson stated he was there as a former member of the Council, and a concerned citizen. He stated the Council worked exhaustively on the Covid Impact Plan, and funds were dispersed so there was something for everyone, but no one entity got everything. The \$5M in transformative grants fund was supposed to help a variety of organizations like small businesses and non-profits, not just one. He stated the County Executive stated he would continue the momentum of what the previous Council and Administration had done concerning ARPA, but has backed away from those commitments. He

stated it seems that bullying and arm twisting is being done, as with the Resolution for RESOLVE.

Freda Tepfer, Erie: Ms. Tepfer stated she was speaking on behalf of Erie County United and others. She recited statistics on child poverty in the city of Erie and the county of Erie. She stated universal basic income is a solution to the problem. She invited the Council to the march they would be having on Saturday the 24th for the 4th Annual Basic Income Day of Action at 1pm in Perry Square. She stated it was also important for the Council to exert its independence; much work had gone into dispersing the ARPA funds, and it shouldn't be thrown to the side. She also supports the Council looking at the process for repository sales.

Scott Rastetter, Washington Township: Mr. Rastetter stated while on Council and discussing the budget, he reminded the others once that this is not a monarchy. He even suggested a name change, because the County Executives tend to believe they are the last word. He asserted they are not the monarchy or the rulers, it is up to the Council to make the decisions, and investigate the details.

Mr. Horton stated he'd be honored to deliver the citation. Mrs. Rennie thanked him.

REPORTS OF COUNTY OFFICIALS

County Executive and/or his Designee	Mr. Lichtenwalter stated there was no report from the County Executive. He had charts he shared with the Council, showing three years of revenue, the other was for the expenditures. He stated the staff was working hard to have the Budget ready.
Finance Committee - Mrs. Schauerman	Mrs. Schauerman reported that the Finance Committee met on Thursday September 15th and submitted to the agenda: Old Business: Items: A-E and New Business: Items: A-G, K-M, & O-BB.
Personnel Committee - Mr. Scutella	Mr. Scutella reported the Personnel Committee met on Thursday September 15th and submitted to the agenda: Old Business: Items: F-L and New Business: Items: H-J, & N.
Other	Mrs. Rennie had a presentation for the Council. She stated that most discussion and excitement takes place at the Finance and Personnel Committees' meetings. She determined that the arguments were two totally different points. She summarized articles from the Home Rule Charter. She listed two purposes under Article I: to make County services and facilities accountable, efficient, and cost effective, and to separate the functions and powers of the County Executive and County Council. She stated that was an important distinction, and had been muddled lately. She expounded on the discussion of "what county government does." She affirmed that they oversee budgets worth hundreds of millions of dollars, and affect the lives and livelihoods of the people of Erie County. She stated that they needed to be especially careful with the legislation and budgets they approve. She pronounced that the powers of the County Council (Article II) were to appropriate all funding and create, remove, and set functions of all departments and entities under the jurisdiction of the County Executive. She stated that the County Executive's duties (Article III) were to supervise employees and departments, and to carry out and enforce what had been set in place by the County Council and the Home Rule Charter. She declared there had been an evolution in both functions over time. The County Executive role has taken on more of a leadership role, rather than a management role. She stated the role of the County Executive should be to work with the Council, not as one of them, to submit clearly defined items for the Council's review. She shared a letter the Council sent to the County Executive recently, asking for procedure to be followed. She announced that the County Council should work as one body. Each Council member represents their constituents, and all of them believe in that. She referred to a clause in the Charter pertaining to the Council; that they should not interfere with the County Executive, his administration, or his appointed officials. She stated that the same idea should pertain to the Council's job and the County Executive interference. Lastly, she expressed that the authority of the Council was unbreakable, unless they allowed it. She declared if

the Council does not respect its own authority, no one else will respect their authority. This would have far-reaching effects.
